

Now, we are not naïve enough to think that we are the first or the only people to grieve over the loss of a pet. And we have experienced the much more devastating loss of people in our family. But that didn't make this loss any easier. It was still a loss and it still hurt.

We learned a lot from Kiesha. She was classically loyal and very protective. She was wonderfully kind, even to our one year old cat with whom she loved to play. She never stopped running, exploring, and enjoying her world. She was lean, strong, and brave. She was both lov-

ing and loved. She was a nearly perfect companion.

I won't forget how she would dig up our bushes, go nuts during thunderstorms tearing up anything and everything to get away from the thunder, and how she would cower if you looked at her cross-eyed. But I will remember those traits, not as flaws, but as what made her unique – and real.

If we want to learn some lessons about how life should be lived, we need only look to our dogs. They don't complain. They just keep being who they are. And they, for reasons I don't fully understand, love us unconditionally. Her shortcomings with us pale in comparison to our

mistakes with her. And yet, to the last, she loved us. As I lament her passing, I'm reminded of that great line delivered by Norman Schwarzkopf, who said, "just be the person your dog thinks you are!" Great advice. I can only try to measure up.

"Surviving for my sister" —- about our own BK Sawyer

Brenda (BK) is a Race participant that is particularly interested in finding a cure for breast cancer. She is a two-time survivor who also lost her older sister to the disease, and the misunderstanding that once surrounded it. From her very first mammogram, Brenda was recommended for follow-up and was soon diagnosed with breast cancer. She survived and because she continued to be

screened regularly, they caught the cancer recurrence two years later in an extremely early and treatable stage. Sadly, her sister chose not to have recommended follow-up for fear of scarring; by the time Brenda and their family had convinced her to seek treatment, her cancer was too advanced. Brenda says she doesn't want anyone else to go through what she and her family have been through and is adamant that women get screened regularly for breast cancer. She has been participating in the Komen Suncoast Race since it started in 1999, and she says she is amazed by the surge in survivors over the years. Brenda remembers being a part of a very small group of women who came out to that first Race. Compared to today, she says it's like being in a sea of survivors. Even though Brenda lives outside of our Service Area and can no longer attend our Race, she has embraced Facebook

and email as a means to fundraise from afar. Brenda posts on her Facebook every day to encourage her friends to give and often shares a picture of her sister and their story. She also emails her friends and family, encouraging them to support her mission and ours to end breast cancer forever. Because of supporters like Brenda, we are one step closer to finding the cures for breast cancer and changing the story of how breast cancer impacts our community.

911 Reflective Address Markers

Time is the enemy. In an Emergency, locating your address as soon as possible is the first step in saving lives and property. Time wasted searching for the proper address is something many callers to 911 don't have. There's a big difference between knowing the address and finding the address.

Improper addressing frustrates emergency responders, but it could be deadly to the resident because of the delays that result. Proper address marking is the responsibility of each resident at MWF.

Together, we can minimize if not eliminate this chronic addressing problem. Your local CERT team has developed an identification program to uniformly mark addresses. We've received outstanding positive feedback on the quality and importance of these address marker signs. If you've seen the signs, you know what a big difference they do make!

In summary, this is a great program! It's very easy to implement, requires minimal effort and will make a definite, positive impact in our wonderful community.

Use this handy form to order your address marker today! This is a voluntary program, not mandatory.

This program is not a fundraiser, all address markers are sold at cost. We just think it's a great idea!



How to order:

- Look at your mailbox first and decide which style below is best for your chosen application.
- It is up to each resident to install their own address marker. Each marker has 4 predrilled holes to make it easy to simply screw to your mailbox post. If you can't figure out a way to fasten it to your mailbox, simply pound a 2x2 wood stake in the ground next to your mailbox and attach your sign to it.
- If you need assistance, inform a CERT team member and we'll arrange to help you out.
- Fill out this form. Drop off your form at a board meeting, mail it to the address below along with your check or hand to one of your community CERT team members along with your payment. (Payment must accompany form).
- Numbers on the 2-sided versions are offset to allow 1 side of the sign to be screwed to your post, while allowing
 the other side of the sign to still be seen.
