Could I Interest You In a Few Caterpillars?

In my April message I mentioned the wonderful weather that spring had brought to our neighborhood. Just a week or so after I wrote about the great weather, we entered another phase of spring ---- The Great Caterpillar Invasion of 2011! I remembered these little guys from last year and recalled what a mess they had made. Little did I realize that 2010 was nothing compared to what we were about to experience this year. For those of you who didn't immediately rush to the internet to figure out what these things are, I am pleased to enlighten you. They are actually the mature larva of the Tussock moth and they really love our Oak and other hardwood trees. In fact, they love them so much that many of the trees around my house have practically no leaves left!

Theories abound on how to deal with the little "cuties." I spoke to people who suggested that we simply sweep them off the house into a pail of soapy water for a "final swim." Great idea if you've got hundreds of them instead of millions! Then there was the one I read on-line that suggested using a "garden flame thrower." I'm not kidding. Apparently these things are available from garden shops, Home Depot and Amazon.com. Just what I need -- "Well, the good news is that the caterpillars are gone, the bad news is that the house burned down!" A friend of mine in the pest control business told me that he sprayed them with insecticide once and when they died they made a horrible, purple mess all over his white stucco house and then the next wave came along a few days later anyway. He ended up painting his house after it was all over. Beyond cleaning up the mess afterwards with a pressure washer I'm not sure what else can be done. I'm told that these kinds of "invasions" do subside after a couple of years, so here's hoping that since this is year #2, that next year they will give us a break! (Did I mention that they have some kind of irritant on them that causes many of us to break out with bumpy red skin and lots of itching?

Yuk!)

I suppose that one of the good things is that as annoying and nasty as these little guys are, they do eventually go away. Of course, they also leave behind a bit of a mess (cocoons, cocoons, cocoons!) that requires some effort to cleanup. But much like many of the problems we face in life (and even sometimes in the

neighborhood!) given enough time to allow for the proper perspective sometimes things have a way of taking care of themselves. Assuming the leaves come back and none of you burned your house down, or used a sledge hammer to mash as many caterpillars as possible (putting holes through your walls), or breathed toxic fumes from insecticide, **The Great Caterpillar Invasion of 2011** will soon be a distant memory.


