### Another Feather by Jim Bain Continue from Cover

You are probably familiar with an Indian headdress. The Plains Indians would collect feathers, typically those of young eagles, and award them to members of the tribe who had distinguished themselves by acts of bravery or honor in battle or by accomplishing something else that would help the tribal community survive and prosper.

Look closely at the picture and you will note a red shouldered hawk feather attached to my bicycle helmet. I found the feather in our pasture at home and stuck it in my helmet for the ride across the plains of America. More accurately, I rode across lowa in the annual RAGBRAI event. It's 500 miles, starts with a ceremonial rear tire dip in the Missouri River and finishes with the even more important front tire dip in the Mississippi. RAGBRAI is seven days of riding with more than 15,000 other riders and as many as 25,000 on some days.

Each "pass through" town embraces the event with a festival. There are street vendors selling food and drink of all kinds. The local churches are all there too. They're raising much needed funds by selling everything from pies and muffins to spaghetti or ham balls. Every town's fire department joined in the fun as well, typically selling grilled things like steak on a stick. Even the local high school cheer leading squads

were there to cheer us on. Music, dancing, and games like human foosball, giant beer pong, and cornhole were part of the scene. The stopover towns did it up even bigger with full blown expos and big name concerts featuring bands like Huey Lewis and the News and Cheap Trick.

Each day, as the route took us through the small towns and corn fields of lowa, we would stop at vendors along the way. Some are famous on this ride, like Mr. Porkchop, the Yogurt Guy, and BackPocket Brewing. Others were as simple as the classic kids' lemonade stand. Without exception, the people of lowa were hospitable and gracious. It was a joy to spend the week in the heartland of America.

While the ride was like a moving city, it was still a ride. Iowa is much more hilly than I would have imagined. We did just under 16,000 feet of climbing during the week and averaged a little over 70 miles each day. And it was not only bicycles. There were recumbent arm driven tricycles, tandems, a couple of unicycles, and even a skateboard. Impressively, even the guys on unicycles and skateboards were there to do the entire 500 miles.

So yes, it was fun. It was rewarding. It was heartwarming. It was challenging. And it was work. The Plains Indians earned their feathers. As I dipped my tire in the Mississippi River, I felt as if I had earned mine.



Here is a comparison of the sales from 1/1/2014 to 6/30/2014 and 1/1/2015 to 6/30/2015 in Meadow Wood Farms according to MLS. The first half of 2014 there were 9 in in MWF ranging from a high o \$300,00 to a low of \$94,349. The first half of 2015 there were 7 sales in MWF ranging from a high \$275,00 to a low of \$172,000.

Please note that 4 out of the 9 sales during the first half of 2014 were lower than the lowest sale price (\$172,000) the first half of 2015. A trend is that the bottom end pricewise has come up considerably. However, the top end has stayed about the same (\$275,000 to \$300,000). Also noted, while some are selling at or close to the listing price, others have had to drop their prices.




