PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: Dave Kane— "Welcome to the Family" resident MWFPOA

We recently had a rather large change around our place. About 113 pounds worth of change to be precise. It seemed the universe decided it was time for us to have another St. Bernard. Now my take on the whole thing was I wanted to wait until fall when it was a little cooler to bring a new beast into our lives. I was also a little partial to a smooth coat, shorter hair, a female, and quite possibly a puppy. But noooo! St. Bernard Rescue was not going to let me get away with that. They called us on a Thursday evening near the end of May and told Deb that they had a voluntary surrender of two St. Bernards in Hillsborough County and could we please pick them up and foster them for awhile. If they weren't picked up immediately they could be put down since the shelter was full.

The next day we drove to Tampa and picked up two Saints, or about 225 pounds of dogs. Sam is four and Hoss is 2 and they are father and son. Their previous owner surrendered them in hopes of finding them a place to live after he couldn't continue keep them at the place he was staying and they had been living as outside dogs for the past year.

We brought them home, immediately bathed them since they smelled a tad and started giving them good groceries. They were both underweight. After having them here for a week, talking with the previous owner and with Rescue, it became obvious that one of them would have to move on to a different home. The dogs helped us make the decision when Sam displayed aggression, which we didn't care for since it interfered with the funny shui of our farm. Rescue took him and we kept Hoss on a "trial" basis. My plan anyway.

Hoss stayed around for two weeks in a foster situation. He relaxed immensely as soon as Sam left. Hoss started to become his own dog, he was able to get attention and not have to wrestle for grub. We recently called Rescue and told them to send us the paperwork, that Hoss was here to stay. So if by chance you see a St. Bernard with a block-head (yes it is and I can prove it) around the neighborhood, be sure to give him a scratch on top of his big noggin. He is the latest change in the Kane homestead.

Do you know which of the top ten causes of death in the United States <u>cannot</u> be PREVENTED, CURED, OR SLOWED? Here's a hint: it is the same disease that affects one in three seniors (that's most of us, folks) and is projected to grow by **40**% by the year 2025 as our population ages.

It's also a disease that changes lives, not only of those afflicted but of their caregivers as well. In some ways, it cruelly robs us of our loved ones before they are actually gone. Have you guessed yet? It's Alzheimer's Disease.

Meadow Wood Farms resident Elizabeth Waller has been personally affected by Alzheimer's. Her father passed away in 2008, having suffered from the disease for five years. Recently, her oldest friend and college roommate Susan was diagnosed, at age 63, with the early-onset type of Alzheimer's. Elizabeth has watched as her contemporary has lost the ability to drive, to cook, to use a computer or perform many other tasks that most of us in our sixties take for granted. As Susan's husband has said, he feels like he bought a ticket for the wrong movie—this was not how their life was supposed to play out. Thanks to many friends, neighbors, and professional caregivers, Susan has been able to remain at home for now, but her life and the lives of those around her have been irrevocably altered.

In addition to being part of Susan's care giving team, Elizabeth has decided to do something on a larger scale to help both raise awareness and funds to promote vital research into prevention, treatment, and caregiver support for Alzheimer's patients and their families. She hopes to form a team of Meadow Wood Farms supporters to participate in the Ocala Walk To End Alzheimer's at Tuscawilla Park on Saturday, September 19th. The walk is only 2.4 miles long, and begins at 8 a.m., with a special ceremony at 9.

"I know how generous and supportive this neighborhood can be", said Elizabeth recently. "I think it would be great for a team to walk together to show the that our MWF community realizes *the end of Alzheimer's starts with US*". Team members are asked to raise funds in memory/honor of friends and loved ones—funds that will be used to find a treatment and even, potentially, a cure—for a disease that will continue to affect all of us in ever larger numbers. Every team member who raises \$100 will get an official "Walk to End Alzheimer's" t-shirt. All funds raised go to our local chapter of the Alzheimer's Association, and of course are fully tax-deductible.


