### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: — VETERANS DAY



I was sitting trying to decide what to write about this month and it didn't take very long for me to come up with the answer. In November we honor our Veterans, and rightfully so. My Dad served in Korea with the 45th Infantry Division prior to, and after the armistice. He has been lucky enough to go on a Korean Veteran Honor Flight and is still "young" enough to participate in a Korean War Veterans group in Omaha where he lives and help the "older guys, because Dave, they are moving a little slower these days."

For me, Veterans Day, Memorial Day and the 4th of July, not only serve as a reminder to celebrate our country and to honor those we've lost, but to say "Thanks" to all the men and women serving our country.

Thank you to the troops and veterans – not only for your sacrifice, but your courage to protect and preserve justice at home and abroad. Thank you to the families who support the brave souls. To those who have lost sons, daughters, spouses or dads, friends or family Deb and I send our deepest condolences and join you in remembering their sacrifice. We are forever in all of your debt.

I found the following online and I would like to share it with you. It says what I feel and says it much better than I ever could. This is titled; What is a Veteran? and was written by Father Denis Edward O'Brien, USMC.

Some veterans bear visible signs of their service: a missing limb, a jagged scar, a certain look in the eye.

Others may carry the evidence inside

them: a pin holding a bone together, a piece of shrapnel in the leg - or perhaps another sort of inner steel: the soul's alloy forged in the refinery of adversity.

Except in parades, however, the men and women who have kept America safe wear no badge or emblem.

You can't tell a vet just by looking.

He is the cop on the beat who spent six months in Saudi Arabia sweating two gallons a day making sure the armored personnel carriers didn't run out of fuel.

He is the barroom loudmouth, dumber than five wooden planks, whose overgrown frat-boy behavior is outweighed a hundred times in the cosmic scales by four hours of exquisite bravery near the 38th parallel.

She - or he - is the nurse who fought against futility and went to sleep sobbing every night for two solid years in Da Nang.

He is the POW who went away one person and came back another - or didn't come back AT ALL. He is the Quantico drill instructor who has never seen combat - but has saved countless lives by turning slouchy, no -account rednecks and gang members into Marines, and teaching them to watch each other's backs.

He is the parade - riding Legionnaire who pins on his ribbons and medals with a prosthetic hand.

He is the career quartermaster who watches the ribbons and medals pass him by.

He is the three anonymous heroes in The Tomb Of The Unknowns, whose presence at the Arlington National Cemetery must forever preserve the memory of all the anonymous heroes whose valor dies unrecognized with them on the battlefield or in the ocean's sunless deep.

He is the old guy bagging groceries at the supermarket - palsied now and aggravatingly slow - who helped liberate a Nazi death camp and who wishes all day long that his wife were still alive to hold him when the nightmares come.

He is an ordinary and yet an extraordinary human being - a person who offered some of his life's most vital years in the service of his country, and who sacrificed his ambitions so others would not have to sacrifice theirs.

He is a soldier and a savior and a sword against the darkness, and he is nothing more than the finest, greatest testimony on behalf of the finest, greatest nation ever known.

So remember, each time you see someone who has served our country, just lean over and say Thank You. That's all most people need, and in most cases it will mean more than any medals they could have been awarded or were awarded.

Two little words that mean a lot, "THANK YOU".

"It is the soldier, not the reporter, who has given us freedom of the press. It is the soldier, not the poet, who has given us freedom of speech. It is the soldier, not the campus organizer, who has given us the freedom to demonstrate. It is the soldier, who salutes the flag, who serves beneath the flag, and whose coffin is draped by the flag, who allows the protester to burn the flag."



## MWF Legacy – Oscar Echegaray

The dew and the morning sun greeted Oscar each day, and we, at the first entrance to MWF, were greeted by Oscar. Every morning as he walked with his two dogs, he gave a friendly smile and a wave at each passing person.

I didn't know much about Oscar, but when I went to the yard sale at his house, I then realized how far he walked each day! I also saw cook books, a computer, and a very neat tool shed. His family then told me how Oscar loved to cook. That compelled me to learn more about Oscar, and I contacted his family. They were so gracious as to send me this story, which I will share with you here.

"Oscar was one of kind, at 91 he lived independently, cooking himself healthy & delicious meals daily. There was nothing he loved more than sharing his culinary gift with family and friends. He never cooked up "a little something", he liked to create full blown feasts with plenty for seconds and left-overs.

His dogs were his other passion. He always had 2, one Boxer, one Rottweiler. They were his companions to the very end. He loved taking them for early morning walks which also gave him the opportunity to see all the neighbors off to work and wish them all "a beautiful day".

Last but not least, the computer and the Internet brought him new knowledge, entertainment and great way to keep in touch with family and friends. At 91 he had an active Facebook account. But he wasn't tied to the computer all day. He only allowed himself his daily computer time after he had completed some kind of household task on his farm. Anything from cutting his own grass to organizing the shed

had to be done before he'd sit down and relax by "surfing the web".





Our father lived a long happy life. He originally came to this country as a 13-year-old boy to attend boarding school at Bolles School in Jacksonville. He then returned to his birth country Cuba where he was a successful business owner & entrepreneur. When the Castro dictatorship took over Cuba he had to flee his homeland because his life was in danger. He came to this country with nothing but the clothes on his back in 1961 and through hard work and determination again became a successful businessman and created a beautiful life for his family.

We miss him greatly but are grateful for the priceless memories that live in our hearts. We were very moved by all the kind words and sweet gestures from the

Meadow Wood Farms community, it was no wonder he loved that place so very much."

Oscar was an electrical engineer. In Cuba, he worked in a sugar refinery. After escaping to the US, he worked as an engineer, and had a place of business in Miami. He had four children, of which a son and daughter are alive and living in the Miami area. A friend of Oscar's moved to Ocala, and he came here and rented an apartment while looking for a permanent place. He bought a lot in MWF and had his house built, and lived here for over 20 years. He was apprehensive at first, to waving each morning while walking, but soon found the residents kind and responsive. He was one of the many fine people living in MWF. We have many angels at MWF, and I think we have stars too. I think Oscar was a star.
