



This is the season for giving. I can think of no better gift than to save a life! We are all homeowners here, so we have the perfect opportunity to do just that. Adopt a homeless cat or dog. There are so many in need of a home and through no fault of their own. Over the last three years, Marion County Animal Center euthanized 16,342 cats and dogs. So, actually the numbers are coming down, finally, but that is a huge number. I mention this statistic just to make my point, there are lots of pets in need. This is just one county. This happens all across the nation. We EACH CAN make a difference and America absolutely can become a no-kill nation.

I have a great love for cats. So much, that in 2001, I founded a non-profit organization, Feline Estate, Inc. (tax-exempt 501 c 3). I started out, all my life, rescuing cats in need, from horse training centers and kill shelters, and anyplace I found one facing death. Wanting to help on a grander scale is why I started a no-kill shelter. Calls from the public began pouring in, once I started it. Taking in all the cats I was able to, I specialized in conversing with people, to see if they really wanted to keep the cat. If a financial or behavioral issue was the reason for inquiring about relinquishing the cat, I counseled him / her offering solutions and did keep many families together. Also, I kept a list of cats who needed a home, when there was no space available, as well as a list of people searching for a certain color or breed of cat. I consider myself a cat connection specialist, connecting the perfect match of cat and humans. I did all aspects myself and personally rescued nearly 600 cats. I got all the medical care and adopted them out.

Due to health issues, I had to drastically scale things down. I decided the best way to reach more people to help with the plight of homeless pets was to write a book. I wrote, Justice For Cats: Caring for Your Cat & Starting a Shelter. It details ways anyone can make a difference and save lives. Tons of medical and behavioral issues are addressed. All topics related to cats are included. The last two chapters are all about starting and operating a shelter. I know most people don't want to go to this extreme, so it's just a couple of chapters. I had no resource when I began, searching in many places. It's a perfect gift for pet lovers and for anyone concerned about the plight of homeless pets. Paperback \$20. Hardcover \$31. I am happy to autograph them. I do have some available. You can read more about my book online, anywhere books are sold. I sell them on amazon, under seller Feline Estate and have a website http://justiceforcats.org. These days, I mainly do TNR (Trap-Neuter-Release) and care for different colonies and provide education to individuals. No, I was never a hoarder, very against that. There is a chapter in the book on that. Please go adopt, pets provide unconditional love and make a house, a home! They truly rescue us!

It's been several months since I agreed to assist Sandy Mollberg with the "lost and found" sideline of her Critter Sitter business. Since then I must admit to being the one who has been lost several times. However, during my wanderings through this delightful neighborhood, I have been impressed with the kindness and friendliness of everyone I have met. There are true Samaritans here who do not look the other way when an animal wanders onto their property.

They have put forth the effort to "detain" the animal safely and cooperated with all attempts to find the rightful owner. A number of dogs have successfully been returned. One evidently "dumped" pregnant cat has been rescued and provided a loving home with a resident family who went above and beyond to accomplish this.

The registry has grown and this is helpful when I receive a call. However, the animals registered still represent a small percentage of those living in the community. Since most "found" critters are not wearing any identification, it's often difficult to know where and how to begin the detective work. Please spread the word among friends and neighbors and encourage them to complete registration forms or get in touch with me if they have questions. Thanks to all of you who have already registered and to those who have helped me help a pet find it's way home again! Stephanie Gordon

MaMaw Pie by Sandy

2 (9 inch) deep pastry pie shell

1/2 stick salted butter

l cup pecans (rough chopped)

1-7 oz. packed flaked coconut

1-8 oz. cream cheese softened

1-14oz. Sweetened condensed milk

1-16oz. Whipped topping

1-14oz. Carmel ice cream topping

Bake pie shells and allow to cool completely. While they are baking, toast coconut and pecans in the butter until golden brown. Let cool. Beat cream cheese and condensed milk until creamy, fold in whipped topping. Now for the fun part: Divide and spread 1/2 cream cheese mix between the two shells, drizzle 1/2 jar of carmel between the two pies, sprinkle half of the pecan/coconut mix on the pies. Repeat the Layers...Put pies in the freezer over night. (I leave mine in the freezer and cut as needed, which is Often!!!)

Pumpkin Pie by Toni A la easy, a la best

1-15oz can Pumpkin

2 eggs

1-14oz. Sweetened condensed milk

2 tsp. cinnamon

1 tsp. nutmeg

1 tsp. ginger

1/2 tsp. ground cloves

9 inch pie shell (I use graham cracker) Optional...

I beat the eggs first, then add 1/2 can pumpkin to the eggs. Add the spices to the other 1/2 of pumpkin and mix well. Then combine both mixtures , adding milk 1/2 can at a time, slow mix.

Pour into the shell and bake at 375 for 50 mins.
