Rescue of the Month: Everyone Meet Trixie Lyn







PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Will You...? Dave Kane—President MWFPOA

I always try to update readers on the happenings from the Association Meeting and this month will be no different. However, this month, besides updating you on the meeting and some general happenings in Meadow Wood Farms, I am also going to include a plea for your help for the good of the residents of Meadow Wood Farms. But more on that shortly.

First, it has been decided that weather permitting, we will be rebuilding the park fence on Saturday February 13th, starting at 9:00 in the morning. Lunch will be provided by the Association, as will water. If you want to supervise, feel free to grab some tools, a pair of gloves and pitch in and help. We will have a couple of tractors with buckets there, to pull the old posts, but could probably use a back-up tractor or two. We need posthole diggers since not all the post are properly spaced, shovels, rakes and tampers; as well as battery operated drills and screw drivers as we are going to screw the boards into the posts. Batteries can be recharged in the pavilion. We will also be installing a new 12' gate and plan to set it back about 8' from the fence line so rigs can pull in and not be hanging part way out into the road while unlocking or locking the gate. If it rains we will probably reschedule for the following weekend. Hopefully we'll see you there.

At every Association meeting I ask members to recognize neighbors for their contributions to Meadow Wood Farms. It's always nice to know our neighbors pay attention to the good things we do and will publicly acknowledge it at our meetings. 

GRANDMA BELL'S SUGAR COOKIES



1 cup Butter 2 cups Sugar 1/2 tsp. Salt 1 tsp. Vanilla 2/3 tsp. Baking Soda

3 Eggs (Beaten) 3 2/3 cups of Flour 2 tsp. Baking Powder

Cream Butter with sugar, soda, salt and vanilla. Add beaten eggs, sift flour, and baking powder

Together. Add to creamed mixture, chill till firm enough to roll. Bake 425 until brown on greased floured sheet. Enjoy!!

3 Eggs 1/2 tsp. Salt


Cream Sugar and Shortening. Add well Beaten Eggs, Sift Flour, soda, salt, cinnamon. Add to Creamed Mixture. Roll

IMPORTANT ELECTION NEWS!

The Florida Presidential Primary will be held on Tuesday, March 15th. Our voting precinct is at St. John's United Methodist Church on Highway 328

Florida holds "closed" primaries, which means that voters can ONLY vote the ballot that is specific to the party they designated when they registered to vote. To be sure you are eligible to vote for a presidential candidate in this primary, you MUST ensure that your registration is current and that you are registered in the correct party. To check your registration, go to www.votemarion.com and click on the "Am I Registered? "Button. Be sure your address and all other information is up to date. The deadline for any changes to be in effect for the March 15 Presidential Primary is February 16,2016, so do it Now! An Open Letter to the Residents of MWF who own pets...

So an offer to "help Sandy" has turned into an almost full time "Occupation". However, it takes a village-and this one has responded. My heartfelt thanks to the folks in our neighborhood who have cared enough to pay attention to animals out there "on their own" and taken appropriate action. Most calls are concerning dogs and I have hosted several at my home temporarily. Some "repeat offenders" are well known and simply to respective owners. The more worrisome are those with no means of identification - when there is no response to email posts on the MWF site, I have reluctantly turned them over to Animal Control. I do follow up by phone—two dogs are presently for adoption (Traveler and #159489).

Moving forward in 2016—a resident on Lake View Drive has offered to donate a dog kennel for use on my property, which will be greatly appreciated. (It isn't here yet, so don't even think about it). This will allow me to confine a dog temporarily in safe surroundings without exposing it to my own animals. There has also been an offer of donations and I will be happy to accept the following types of items:

- 1. clean throw rugs, towels, or blankets as crate/doghouse liners (old ones that you would otherwise discard)
- 2. Sturdy food/water bowls
- 3. Collars/leashes (lead ropes also work well with larger dogs)
- 4. Dog Kibble



I am not intending to set up an actual "rescue" because I cannot take on the Financial responsibility for healthcare that these animals often need. However, sending a dog away with that Animal Control Truck reduces me to tears— Yes, I would like to save them all! The "good" news is that Marion County Animal Services does not immediately euthanize an animal they pick up unless it is a case of clear aggression, severe illness or injury. It is checked for a microchip, held as a "stray" for 3 days, and then neutered, given immunizations, and "cleaned up". It is then made available for adoption— the photos are posted on their website, Petfinder, and possibly other rescue sites.

I would like to request that any of you have not completed the registry form for your pet (s), do so in the New Year. That information may assure that you quickly get your pet back if he/she "escapes" at some point—we all say that won't happen-but unpredictable circumstances do arise.

2. Remove providers who have received negative reviews:

While we are hesitant to remove providers after one negative comment (after all, anyone can have a bad day), we <u>will</u> remove any provider for whom we receive two or more negative reviews. For example, we recently removed our only entry under PLUMBING for that reason. Please, if you have a good plumber, submit a nomination!

I hope that this explains a few details that will help make the Directory more useful and user-friendly. Keep nominating your favorite service providers--they WILL get more business, thanks to you!






