#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



#### DO YOU FEEL BEAUTIFUL?

As mentioned in the July newsletter, one of my goals as President of the MWFPOA is to expand our pool of leadership and participation by revitalizing the three standing committees that have been without a chair for several years.

I am very grateful to report that we have already had someone step forward to assume the chair of the MEMBERSHIP committee. Linda Lemisch, who lives with her husband Tony and assorted animal companions on Wood Ridge Drive, has volunteered to take charge of recruiting new members for the Association. She will work closely with both Dick Woodrome, our Treasurer, and Della Brock, the chair of the Welcome Committee, to identify new residents and introduce them to the myriad joys and benefits of becoming a POA member. Linda remembers with great fondness the day her own Welcome Basket was delivered two years ago. She also, along with the Executive Board, feels strongly that we can improve on the percentage of residents who choose to join and participate in the activities and responsibilities inherent in maintaining a healthy neighborhood.

The next committee opening is for the "BEAUTIFICATION AND PARK" standing committee. The by-laws don't actually outline the duties of this group, but in the past it was involved primarily in the landscaping and maintenance of the East and West front entrances. This was a frustrating enterprise due to our lack of access to water to enable us to appropriately care for new plantings. In response, the Association redesigned the entrances to allow for water-free maintenance and a tidy appearance. The entrances are thus relatively effort-free, with the notable exception of the wonderful holiday decorations provided by residents Stan and Nancy Kostoff.

However, beautification of our community is not limited to the entrances alone. For one thing, the name of the committee is "Beautification and Park". The Park is currently maintained primarily by the Maintenance Task Force, but they usually confine their efforts to the pavilion structure. When there is an Association event to be held at the pavilion, a general call goes out to the neighborhood to pick up sticks, rake leaves, and clean the sidewalks. Other than that, the Park is pretty neglected. A motivated Beautification Committee could certainly explore ways to make the Park more attractive—remembering, as always, that there is no water available on site.

Another activity that really cries out to be managed by a Beautification Committee is a regularly scheduled community Cleanup day. Litter does accumulate on the roadside, but experience has shown that the entire community can be efficiently policed in only a few hours as long as someone steps forward to organize the date and recruit the volunteers. It makes a huge difference, but so far no one has accepted the responsibility for maintaining a regular schedule.

There are lots of other opportunities for an enterprising Beautification committee to help promote a feeling of pride in MWF ownership. It is my understanding that there used to be a competition in the neighborhood for the best holiday lighting display, with prizes provided by the Association. And what about a competition for best farm sign? If you are *feeling* beautiful, please let the Executive Board know, or call me at 352-304-8871. We need you!

#### Meadow Wood Farms - 30 MPH All Roads / Have a Nice Day

As a member of the board of directors for the MWFPOA I would have to say that speeding is perhaps the most common complaint within our community. We have received suggestions from owners about speed bumps, more stop signs, and having additional speed limit signs throughout the community.

I am relatively a newcomer to the board but other members say this has been a problem for as long as they can remember and has been addressed numerous times. Stop signs are not intended, nor function effectively for speed control. Speed bumps are unsightly, cause discomfort for people with certain medical conditions, and have a long list of undesirable effects. We've been informed that the existing signage is adequate. Besides, having speed signs on every block would detract from the beauty of our community. We have received additional law enforcement efforts and I'm told there were a number of drivers who were ticketed for both speeding, seatbelt, and stop sign violations. The stepped up enforcement hasn't resolved the speeding problem.

I personally make it a habit of adhering to the speed limit (within this development). And that part of the sentence "within the development" is what got me thinking about what we can do to help with this problem. It got me thinking "why am I willing to somewhat push my luck elsewhere but strictly follow the speed limit within our community"? I realized that it isn't respect for the law, nor the threat of receiving an expensive ticket which influences my driving habits. It is out of respect for my neighbors and our beautiful community that I ease the pressure off that accelerator when I enter Meadow Wood Farms.

With this in mind I petitioned our board for the purchase of the new signs now hanging at our entrances. As you leave they wish you to "Have a nice Day". It is my hope that as you return they serve as a reminder that we, as a community, all benefit when we are considerate of the safety and well-being of our neighbors.

Special thanks to Wayne Hebert for help in the design and acquisition of these signs.

#### NEWS YOU CAN USE—ELECTION INFORMATION

As election years go, I think everyone can agree that this one is a doozy. Our next opportunity to let our voices be heard is on Tuesday, August 30<sup>th</sup>, when the State of Florida will hold a congressional primary. A number of local offices will also appear on the ballot in primary contests.

Remember, Florida is a CLOSED PRIMARY STATE. This means that voters may only cast ballots for the party they are registered for. In a General Election, you may vote for anyone on the ballot regardless of party, but for this August election, you must have a party affiliation on file to help decide who the November candidates will be. If you are at all unsure about your party affiliation, you may check and update your registration online (www.votemarion.com). However, all changes to your registration must be made by August 1, 2016, to be in effect for the August 30 primary. \*\*Special note for August 30 primary: because no Democrat has filed to run for the District 22 Florida House of Representatives seat, the two Republican candidates will appear on ALL ballots and this contest will serve as the general election in this one case. All other contests on your ballot will be party -specific.\*\*

If you prefer to vote by mail (formerly known as absentee voting), you may request to receive a mail ballot <u>at any time</u> by going in person to the Elections Office, calling by phone, or going online. Vote by mail ballots should be returned in the U.S. Mail by August 23 to ensure they will be counted.

Early voting will also be available at a number of sites throughout the county between August 20 and 27.

The polls will be open on Election Day from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. If you live within Meadow Wood Farms, your polling place is at St. Johns United Methodist Church on Highway 328.

Please do remember to vote. This year the Primary will determine November candidates for the U.S. Senate, House of Representatives, Florida Senate and Florida House. Make sure the candidate of <u>your</u> choice for <u>your</u> party appears on the General Election ballot.
