NEWS YOU CAN USE: ELECTION INFORMATION

I doubt that anyone living in Meadow Wood Farms is unaware that the 2016 General Election will be held this month. Our ballot includes, among other things, the opportunity to vote for President of the United States and a Senator from Florida to represent us in the Congress. There are also four Constitutional Amendments that will be put before Florida voters for their approval. Unlike a Primary election, in a general election, all registered voters receive the <u>same</u> ballot and may vote for any candidate or question on the ballot.

<u>Early Voting</u> is now underway at nine locations in Marion County. Early voting hours are 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. every day through Saturday, November 5th. Consult <u>www.votemarion.com</u> for Early Voting locations.

<u>Vote by Mail</u> ballots can still be requested online, in person, or by ballot must reach the Election Center (by 7 pm on Tuesday, November 8th to be counted.

<u>Election Day</u> is Tuesday, November 8th. The polls will be open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. The polling place for all MWF residents is St. Johns United Methodist Church on Highway 328.

Please note that you must be a registered voter to vote using any of these methods. Voter registrations expire if you have not voted in two consecutive 4-year election cycles. The opportunity to register for this specific election ended on October 18, 2016.

1 lg. Cauliflower

Fresh Thyme

2 Bay Leaves

4 cups Veg or Chicken Stock

1/3 cup melted Butter

Fresh Cracked Pepper

Boil the cauliflower with all the spices.

For 12 mins. Drain and transfer to a

oven pan.

Sprinkle more thyme, pepper and more butter to top.

Roast for 15 mins. until brown. At 400 degrees.

2 lg. Eggs

1 1/2 cups all purpose Flour

1 tsp. baking soda

1/2 cup light brown sugar

1/4 salt

1 tsp. Vanilla

1 tsp. cinnamon

3/4 cup melted butter

1/2 cup milk

Spray pan / pre heat 350 degrees

Topping goes first, mix butter, brown sugar, cinnamon, apples (cut thin) mix together and place into the sprayed pan.

 Mix cake mix, flour, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, butter, eggs, sugar, vanilla, milk

Pour on top of apples. Let sit for two minutes, then bake for 40 mins.

Don't flip for 15 mins after cake sits out of oven.
