Request For Proposal

To: All Interested Parties

Subject: Meadow Wood Farms Mowing Proposal

Date: December 1, 2016

Proposals are hereby requested for a 24-month contract for the purpose of mowing and trimming the grass in the common areas of Meadow Wood Farms, Ocala, FL. Common areas include East and West subdivision entrances and Friendship Park. The following details are provided:

- Term: Contract will commence on or about March 1, 2017 and expire on February 28, 2019.
- Scope and Schedule: Provide proposals for EACH of the following numbers of mowings showing prices for entrances and park separately:
 - o Entrances and park to be mowed 14 times between April & October on a schedule to be determined after contract is awarded.
 - Entrances to be mowed 24 times and park to be mowed 5 times between April and October on a schedule to be determined after proposal is awarded.
- Weed and shrub trimming, edging, blowing, and debris removal as needed
- Entrances include areas adjacent to entry roads & fences extending, at a minimum, 6 fence posts in either direction
- Proposal should include proposed fees with payment to be made in equal monthly payments over the term of the contract
- An hourly rate should also be included in the proposal for incidental requests for additional mowing services, such as community events, vacant properties, water retention areas, etc.
- Proof of liability and workers compensation insurance (if applicable) should be included with the proposal

The MWFPOA reserves the right to accept or reject any proposal at will. Residence in Meadow Wood Farms and Membership in the MWFPOA, while not required, will positively influence the contract award.

Speaking of dinner! Once again all of our neighborhood cooks provided great sides and desserts. As always, they came through for a Meadow Wood Farms event. If anyone went home hungry, well it's your own fault. Our Chili Cook-Off contestants made their creations hard for Nancy Barclay to judge, but Ian Reade took home the top prize this year. Thank you to all the contestants and to Nancy. I hope to see you all next year.

To all of those who helped set up and take down the tables and chairs, well, no event in MWF would take place without your help. Thank you so much for your labors.

The last two folks I want to thank really helped make this event possible. First was Sandy Mollberg. Without her helping hawk tickets around MWF, we couldn't be half the success we are for this event. Next, I would like to thank Deb. She has supported my efforts in this endeavor for the last 3 years and was the chief cook for the pork this year. Without these two ladies this event would not have been as seamless as it appears.

There may be some folks who wonder how we can make this all work for 95 people at \$5 a ticket and Vet and First Responders eat for free. It's pretty simple actually, and again, it's Meadow Wood Farms that makes it all possible.

We sold 61 tickets at \$5 for a total of \$305 and got \$35 in donations for a grand total of \$340. MWFPOA last year also agreed to contribute up to \$250 as needed to this event. We had expenses this year of roughly \$372. The difference between the \$340 (in tickets sold and the donations) and the expenses is \$32. That means MWFPOA contributed \$32 to this event. To look at it another way, we fed the 95 expected attendees for a total MWFPOA contribution of less than 34 cents per person.

Isn't Meadow Wood Farms just the best place to live? Thank you all and see you next year.



It seems like an appropriate time for an update from the Pet Safety "Committee".

Although this began as a "committee of one", I find it is augmented enormously by so many MWF residents.

You have donated and erected a kennel on my property, you have given financial support as well as food, bowls, collars, bedding, and sundry other items to assist with the temporary care of "lost" animals.

You have also stepped up to notify me of wanderers or "problems", help me chase them down, or hold them in a safe place until I can "catch up". A special thanks to Sandy Mollberg, who is quick to respond to my requests re: where a particular animal probably resides.

I've also just been made aware recently of another generous monetary donation from a resident – many, many thanks to you. For the record, I have responded to approximately 50 calls in the past year – most were related to dogs, although there were three equines, 2 cats, and one pig (the pig doesn't live in Meadow Wood Farms). In many cases, the animal was readily identified and returned to the owner. Some of these were "frequent fliers".

Three dogs were turned in to Animal Control when they were without identification, were not microchipped, and efforts to locate an owner were unsuccessful. There is also a new initiative to make residents more aware of the service – a letter of explanation and introduction with a registry form will now be included in the welcome basket for new residents. I encourage anyone who has pets, but has not registered them with me, to do so as soon as possible. If you need forms, please give me a call at 484-802-3786 or email me at sgordon4313@gmail.com. What often remains an unsolved dilemma is the issue of dogs that are repeatedly out on the roads unattended. Of course, I have no authority to "enforce" rules, but if the owner is known, I am available to contact them, meet with them, etc. Sometimes this is successful, sometimes not so much.

One dog beat the odds, even though I did not intend to increase my personal pet population. The Jack Russell mix I picked up on 9/11 has decided to stay, for better or worse. Frazier is not exactly problem free – but we are adapting.

1 1/2 cup Low fat Mozzarella Cheese


1/2 cup Parmesan Cheese




