Maximize Space on a Small Farm

There are a lot of horse "ranchettes" that are minimal in size, about 2-10 acres in total. The UF/IFAS recommended stocking rate is about 2 acres per horse, and if we are going to push that limit our management must be top notch.


Tips:

1. Create a sacrifice area.

- a. An area used to turn horses out, accepting that no grass will grow.
- Allows horses to be out and enjoy "horse life" without denuding your pastures by overgrazing.
- Utilize an area that has ample shade, and one that might not be best suited for grass cover anyways.



- a. Protect your grass by only allowing it to be grazed to an appropriate height before resting it and moving the horses to another paddock.
- Cross fencing with electrical tape fencing is a simple way to implement rotational grazing.
- Bahia grass pastures should only be grazed to 2-3 inches, then a recovery and regrowth period is necessary.



3. Properly Manage Manure.

- Often more manure is produced than there is space available to spread it, so must find alternate avenues for waste management.
- b. A 3-bin compost system works well on small farms and provides a storage system that generates smaller batches of finished compost that can then be spread at an appropriate rate onto pastures.
- Employ a licensed manure hauler to periodically remove your manure before it becomes an environmental hazard.
- d. Do not store manure near a water source or in an area susceptible to storm water runoff; nutrients in the manure will easily contaminate the



MEADOW WOOD FARMS DEED RESTRICTIONS QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

The Meadow Wood Fanns POA has received several inquiries pertaining to our Deed Restrictions.

The first questions come from a Mr. A. Lincoln, Esq. of Hodgenville, KY.

Q: I am interested in purchasing a wooded lot in Moodow Wood Farms, clearing most of the trees and using them to build several small one room log cabins to be used as vacation residences. I also plan to construct a centrally located communal outhouse as well as a church. Additionally, on a recent trip to the Middle East, I acquired a slightly used Bedouin tent and a carnel. I plan to erect the tent as one of the vacation residences. Can you tell me if any of these plans would be permitted under the Meadow Wood Farms Deed Restrictions?

A: Dear Mr. Lincoln, The following deed restrictions apply to your plans:

- a. 1. No more than one residential structure and non-contiguous guesthouse may be constructed or maintained per platted lot, plot or tract.
- b. 2. The ground floor area of any single-family family residence shall be not less than one thousand (1,000) square feet. For computing the 1,000 square feet requirement, the owner may include one half of the square footage of garages, carports, screened porches, covered entries, covered patios that are attached to the residence.
- c. 6. No church or religious home shall be constructed on the above-described property without the consent of all adjoining property owners, together with the written consent of three-quarters (3/4) of the property owners within two thousand (2,000) feet of the location of said church or religious home.
- 8. No tent, construction shack or barn shall be erected on the property and used for residential purposes.
- e. 11. All lavatories and toilet facilities shall be located inside the main residential buildings, or structures provided for herein, and connected with outside septic tanks constructed in accordance with the standards and requirements prescribed by law and local and state health authorities at the time of construction. The laws of the State of Florida and the County of Marion as well as the rules and regulations of their administrative agencies, now and hereafter in effect, with regard to sewage disposal, water supply and sanifation, are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

As you can see most of your plans would be in violation of the Meadow Wood Farms Deed Restrictions and as such, would not be permitted. It would be your responsibility to obtain the necessary consents from property owners to build the church. Thank you for your interest in Meadow Wood Farms.

Manure Management 101

The average, 1000lb horse will accumulate nearly 10 tons of manure and stall waste each year. Multiply that number by the amount of horses in your herd and that is your annual manure contribution. The unfortunate link between the nutrients in horse manure (Nitrogen and Phosphorus being the key components of concern) and our livelihood is the degradation of our clean and dwindling supply of water.

What is *eutrophication*? A condition in an aquatic ecosystem where high nutrient concentrations stimulate algae blooms, and these algae blooms create a barrier for the sunshine to reach aquatic life under the surface of the water leading to the demise of aquatic life and poor water quality.

With the exponential population growth expected to occur in Florida by 2030, natural resources such as water will become increasingly vital to protect through educational efforts and implementation of Best Management Practices. The eutrophication of our Central Florida water sources poses a great threat to the quality of life in this area and far beyond. Agriculture has a major responsibility to uphold in protecting our water with improved farm management practices and proper manure handling.





To mitigate nutrient runoff and leaching on horse farms:

- 1. Do not stockpile your manure in an area susceptible to storm water runoff.
- 2. Locating the pile away from nearby water sources and on an impervious surface is ideal.
- 3. Providing a cover over the waste pile will prevent rain events from causing the pile to leach extra nutrients.
- 4. Composting manure is a feasible way to stabilize nitrogen in manure, and produce a useable soil amendment that can be spread at an IFAS recommended rate on pastures.
- 5. Avoid at all cost the dumping of manure in or around sinkholes on your property.
- 6. Employ a licensed manure hauler to remove your manure stockpile if the volume exceeds an amount that can be managed properly.




