Community Matters

Despite a number of houses purchased by me and my spouse in the past, we had never purchased a property with Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions until we moved to Meadow Wood Farms.

That caused me to try to learn a little more about how they first came to be.

Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions came into being largely as a way to control who was allowed to buy property or a home in a particular area. During the 1920s and 1930s they were usually written as a way to exclude individuals or families due to religion, race, ethnicity, or social class.

The Supreme Court of the United States ruled in 1926, that Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions were a private matter as it was a private contract between two parties.

When this issue was revisited in 1948 by the Supreme Court, it was found that exclusionary Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions violated the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution under the Equal Protection Clause.

That said, our Meadow Wood Farms Property Owners Association Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (Deed Restrictions and Bylaws) are in place to provide a feel and a look that serves this particular community. They exist for the sole reason of protecting and maintaining property values and to provide a look of continuity throughout our subdivision.

Needles -Wikipedia

Needles (April 29, 1953 – October 15, 1984) was an <u>American Hall of Fame Champion Thoroughbred racehorse</u>. In 1956, he became the first Florida-bred horse to win the <u>Kentucky Derby</u> and also won the <u>Belmont Stakes</u>.

Background

Needles was a bay colt bred and raised in Ocala, Florida. He was the descendant of Blenheim and a son and grandson of Kentucky Derby winners Ponder and Pensive. Needles was a sickly foal who was given his name because of the numerous veterinary injections he was given to overcome broken ribs and pneumonia. Needles' dam Noodle Soup was a descendent of the influential Irish broodmare Golden Harp.

Racing career

At age two, Needles won six of ten starts, including the prestigious <u>Hopeful Stakes</u>. His performances that year earned him the 1955 championship as two-year-old colt.

Ridden by <u>David Erb</u>, Needles was a crowd favorite for his come-from-behind style, sometimes overcoming a 15-length deficit. The betting favorite, Needles won the 1956 <u>Kentucky Derby</u> by coming from 16th place in a field of 17 to make up 24 lengths and win going away. His victory marked the first time a Florida-bred horse won America's most prestigious horse race.

In the <u>Preakness Stakes</u>, the next leg of the <u>U.S. Triple Crown</u> races at <u>Pimlico Race Course</u>, Needles finished second to the <u>Calumet Farm</u> colt <u>Fabius</u>, whom he had beaten in the Derby. Needles then came back in <u>New York</u> to win the grueling 1½-mile <u>Belmont Stakes</u>, the final leg of the Triple Crown races. <u>Career Boy</u> finished second and Fabius ran third. Needles earned another championship as three-year-old colt in 1956.

At age four, Needles started three times, finishing 1, 2, and 3. His 1957 racing season ended early following an injury.

Stud record

Needles was sent to stand at <u>stud</u> at owner Bonnie Heath's breeding farm in <u>Marion County, Florida</u>. Needles' success in racing sparked a boom in Florida horse breeding which, among others, produced notable runners such as <u>Carry Back</u> and <u>Affirmed</u>.

Needles died in 1984 at the age of 31. His heart and hooves are buried in the Garden of Champions at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company Pavilion. In 2000, he was inducted into the United States National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame.

Pet Safety Committee

The "Pet Safety Committee" has been silent for the past 2 months in terms of literary contributions. I'm hoping that all neighbors, both 2 and 4 footed, have had safe and celebratory holidays. I'm also thinking that perhaps February is a fitting time to request that residents of MWF who have animal companions take a few moments to complete registration forms for their pets. I have 75 animals registered with me, representing just 33 of the approximately 370 occupied homes in Meadow Wood.



When I receive a call about either a lost or found animal, my first step is to check those registration forms. About 95% of the time, there is no match and I'm back at "square one". It is not a difficult or terribly time consuming form – and it can make a huge difference to the pet that is "out there" – possibly lost, hungry, frightened, at risk of injury. The form is available online on the MWF website. I can also deliver to you as many as are needed. Is your dog, cat, horse, or whatever worth the time invested?

And speaking of unidentified "residents" – Sherlock is still with me and scheduled for neuter surgery, immunizations, and whatever else can be accomplished under anesthesia on January 24th. He has progressed slowly, as expected. He is now permitted into my sunroom for an hour a day under supervision. He remains a delightful, funny, energetic dog and rehab will continue. Stop by and see him – I encourage socialization with other dogs and with humans. He is never aggressive and has approached my cats with an invitation to play – needless to say, they emphatically declined.

Is it spring yet in Ocala?? Stay warm my friends – and call me if you have questions.






