#### MEADOW WOOD MEMORY WALKERS 2018—HELP US TO STAY ON TOP!

Last year, the Meadow Wood Memory Walkers was the #1 Team in the 2017 Walk to End Alzheimer's. With your help, we raised \$13,000 to fund research, education, and direct patient care to fight this dreadful disease. Won't you help us again in our effort to prevent, cure and treat Alzheimer's?

The cause is even more significant to me personally this year. As many of you know, I walk in memory of my Dad and also in honor of my dear friend and college roommate, Susan Woods. This year, Susan lost her five-year battle with early onset Alzheimer's disease. Her actual death on April 16<sup>th</sup> was simply the culmination of the day by day disintegration of her memories, her body, and her unforgettable personality. I will never stop walking, for Susan and for the millions like her who are faced with this terrible and debilitating condition.

Allow me to share some shocking statistics with you:

- \*Between 2000 and 2015, deaths from heart disease fell 11%, while dementia-related deaths increased by 123%
- \*5.7 million people in the United States are currently living with Alzheimer's; that is ONE IN TEN of those of us over 65. By 2050, that number could rise to 14 million
- stAlzheimer's is the 6 $^{
  m th}$  leading cause of death in the US, the 5 $^{
  m th}$  leading cause for those of us over 65
- \*Alzheimer's kills more people each year than breast and prostate cancer COMBINED
- \*Someone in the US develops Alzheimer's every 65 seconds
- \*One in three seniors dies with some form of dementia

But the fact is, if you or a loved one is diagnosed, statistics mean nothing. CARE becomes the only issue. Patients, caregivers and family members are all deeply affected by the burden of providing a safe and comforting environment for Alzheimer's patients; the financial and emotional toll is overwhelming.

- \*The cost of caring for Alzheimer's patients in 2018 will be approximately 277 BILLION dollars. By 2050, that amount could be over ONE TRILLION dollars.
- \*The total per person out of pocket costs are five times higher for Alzheimer's patients than for seniors without Alzheimer's.

  Nationwide, Medicare/Medicaid offer only limited coverage for this care.

So what can be done? Research into preventing, treating, and finding a cure is essential, but so are lobbying efforts for increased support for at-home and long-term care. Unlike certain other life-threatening conditions, care for Alzheimer's patients involves no expensive drugs, machines, or surgeries. Alzheimer's is just the beginning of a long, slow, but inevitable decline requiring full-time personal care and a secure environment. Many families are at a loss as to how to properly care for an Alzheimer's patient at home, but cannot afford an appropriate placement in a memory care facility without additional help.

The Alzheimer's Association is the only patient advocacy group in the US that provides comprehensive support for all of the aspects of Alzheimer's: funding for research, lobbying for better government and insurance support, education for the general public, and direct help for families and patients. Their main fundraising event is the annual Walk to End Alzheimer's, and once again our neighborhood is sponsoring the *Meadow Wood Memory Walkers* team. This year's Ocala walk is on Saturday, September 29th at 9:30 a.m. in Tuscawilla Park downtown. It's only a 2-mile route, with shorter alternatives for slower walkers. Well-behaved dogs, goats, miniature horses and children on leashes are welcome. Please donate, join our team or just come along for the walk. Remember: *THE END OF ALZHEIMER'S BEGINS WITH YOU*.

#### STREET LIGHTS



#### **Out & About**

We have an incredibly diverse neighborhood here in MWF. Some of us are from up north and some are from south Florida. Some are young and some are older. Some have been here many years and some are just moving in. We come from all walks of life with a broad array of different experiences and yet we all live HERE. As such we share a community, in MWF, in Ocala, and in Marion County. Presumably, we all live here because we like living here. In the coming issues of our monthly newsletter, I hope to offer some musings and experiences from simply being out and about in the world that surrounds us. Hopefully, you will enjoy reading about them and be inspired to experience some of the wonderful opportunities that are all around the little slice of heaven that we call home.

This month we focus once again on the entertainment sector. If you haven't experienced the Reilly Arts Center, you have missed a true Ocala treat. Located just 5 blocks from Ocala's Historic Downtown Square in picturesque Tuscawilla Park, the Reilly Arts Center is Ocala's home for the arts and live entertainment. Featuring state-of-the-art acoustics and production equipment, the 700-seat venue hosts an eclectic assortment of events, concerts, meetings, and parties and has become a hub for the arts in Ocala. The Reilly opened in October of 2015 after a \$2.7 million renovation to the City Auditorium - a WPA project that was built in 1936. Over the decades the auditorium hosted countless Ocala proms, graduations and concerts including artists like Buddy Holly (1957) and the Boston Pops (1965.) There isn't a bad seat in the house.

A couple of weeks ago, several of us from MWF attended Classic Albums Live, a regular musical troupe at the center. In short, these world-class musicians select a classic album and duplicate it "cut for cut and note for note." Our latest trip back in time was to the Beatles "White Album," produced in 1968. This is not a tribute band. They make no attempt to look like the old bands they are presenting. It is ALL about the music. What music it is! I shut my eyes and was transported back to high school. Each of their performances has been the same – a stunning experience!

This troupe, whose players change to best present the music, has been to the Reilly to do albums by Pink Floyd (Dark Side of the Moon), the Eagles (Hotel California), Fleetwood Mac (Rumors), and more. They have done the music from Woodstock and Led Zeppelin. Classic Albums Live will be back to the Reilly in October to do the Eagles Greatest Hits album. We already have our tickets. The only thing we haven't decided is where to have dinner before the show.

Speaking of dinner, we took the opportunity before the Beatles show to enjoy ourselves at Backwoods Smokehouse and Grill, a relatively new restaurant on US 27, just north of  $110^{\rm th}$  Ave. It offers large portions of mouthwatering great food, featuring smoked ribs, the sweetest cornbread you will ever eat, and homemade desserts to die for. Are steaks or hamburgers your thing? They have those too. Moderately priced, it is a relaxed, friendly, and comfortable place to share a meal with friends. If you haven't been there, make it a point to go. You'll be glad you got out and about. I know we were.
