Farm Management Field Day

A plethora of information regarding the services offered by the UF Extension Office to the community was provided at the Field Day Event held at Coryat Farm on March 2, 2019. In addition to the year round educational events, from Florida Native Landscaping to Pasture Management and Equine Health and First Aid, their office is available for questions and advice. For example, if you have questions about whether a weed in your pasture is harmful to equine or other livestock, or if you would like to test your soil to see exactly what kind of fertilizer you need, you can call or email them anytime. They are also available for individual farm visits to address your specific needs. Finally, for your benefit, at the extension office there are posters of poisonous weeds that are dangerous to horses and livestock. I hung mine in the tack/feed room.

During the event, we had considerable discussion regarding grazing and pasture management. Caitlin Bainum, from the UF/IFAS extension office, also spoke at length about manure management. I have a 3 bin compost system on my farm. Very uncomplicated and made out of wood, found at Lowes, and chicken wire. Most of us have a need for something like this, as the average horse generates 9 tons of manure each year. The heat generated in the compost bin by microorganisms living in the manure pile will destroy weed seeds and parasite larvae and eggs.

Composting also benefits the environment by stabilizing the nutrients in manure, making them less likely to be potential pollutants to surface or ground water. Compost can also be applied to pastures as a slow-release fertilizer, reducing the risk of parasite re-infection and the need for chemical fertilizers. Composting also reduces the odor and fly problems commonly associated with manure.

If you would like additional information on any of these subjects you can visit your local extension office. They have many enlightening handouts that are free for the taking.



DRIVE TIME IN MWF

We are so blessed to live in a beautiful equine community here in Meadow Wood Farms. I'm sure many of you have been driving though MWF and come across someone driving their horse or their team of horses & wondered about them. I know I have. I'm sure many of you have stopped to talk to them or just snapped a picture or two. I know I have. Thinking about this made me think many of you would want to know more about our active horse neighbors. I knew I did.

Jim and Gail Thomas have been our seasonal neighbors in MWF for many years and have recently bought 11 Nashua Way to be our full time neighbors moving here from Oskaloosa Kansas. They brought 3 Welsh ponies with them. Both Jim and Gail drive the ponies and have shown the ponies in pleasure driving shows and combined driving events throughout the Midwest and Southwest. Recently, Gail started driving the Welsh palomino pony mares as a pair. Blondie is a singles driving champion and Cookie is new to driving. When you see them be sure to wave and slow down to watch them go. You may also see them driving Romeo, a single pleasure driving pony. He is a real sweetheart!

Louis and Marjorie Godines drive Bo, a 14 year old Turkoman, Lipizzan, Percheron cross gelding. They also have a pair of Morgan geldings back in Michigan. Pete and Elf were homebreds raised and trained by Cloyd Ramsey. They acquired the pair after Cloyd's passing in May of 2017. 




