## Introducing...

We are lucky to have volunteers who are committed to serving our neighborhood here in Meadow Wood Farms (MWF). Quite a few residents serve on our standing committees. (See page 2 for a complete list.) This month, we feature and introduce you to the Chair of our **Control Committee**, Elaine Hager. She has been on the committee for 3 years, joining when she retired and when she found she had time, desire, and ability to give back to the community.



Elaine has been a Florida resident since 1976, but her connections to MWF began in 1984, when her parents

moved into the neighborhood (and when there were only about 90 residents). Her path leading to residence in MWF first took her through a 20-year career working as a farm manager for assorted thoroughbred farms around the country, then later as a sales consultant for thoroughbred consigners, with OBS being one of the smaller locales. When it came time to get off the road and become a little more settled, Elaine purchased a home on Count Fleet and later built her current home on Wood Ridge Drive.

Her next career was based in Ocala and was also associated with horses, but this time focused on the sale of farm supplies. Beginning as a clerk with Horseman's Farm Supply ultimately led to a position as store manager with new owners, Jim and Jerry. Many of you may frequent the store now known as J & J Tack. The 18-year ride with J & J allowed Elaine to shine, as she grew the business to be their #1 store out of 8 stores across Florida. This was despite adversities that included the county displacing and consuming half of the property when they expanded Highway 40, as well as a fire that destroyed the original store across from its current location.

Elaine continues to apply a strong work ethic, energy, and intentional good will to her work in MWF. "We all need to be good stewards of the community." The three-member committee is responsible for "minding the store," helping to maintain adherence to our deed restrictions. (Note that a third member is still needed.)

Reported complaints typically involve property value detractors such as fencing that is in disrepair or yards that are not maintained. **Hello Neighbors!** Have you ever heard of "curb appeal?" It's a real estate term for the way that a house looks from the street. If a potential client is looking for a home, what is the first thing they see? A neat and tidy home, decent roof and clean siding on the house, lawn mowed, fencing nicely maintained... or a home in need of paint or mildew spraying, broken boards on the fence, messy yard, clumps of weeds here and there...?

If you want to get an idea of how your home would look to a potential buyer, take a photo. Take of good look at your home's "curb appeal." Would you want to buy that home? How you maintain your home makes a big difference to your neighbors, too. A nice home next to you can increase your home's potential value. A dump next door brings the value down.

My dad was in the military, and our family moved every 2 years. I have been in and out of so many houses and apartments, I've lost count. I also come from a family of real estate agents, so I developed a pretty good eye for property values. That is why, as President, I feel my most important job here is to try and maintain our property values.

I would ask not only those who live on our entrance roads, but all residents, to check their "curb appeal." Take a photo of the front of your home, and ask yourself how it would look in an ad. 
