The unique nature of this year's walk was a distinct advantage for the MWMW team; instead of participating in one crowd event in downtown Ocala, pandemic precautions dictated a number of small and socially distanced walks in dozens of neighborhoods across the county. Can you imagine a more beautiful and friendly venue than our very own community? Not only that, but the circumstances allowed the participation of members on golf carts, with dogs, and even on horseback. I think that most team members would agree that this format was much more fun and even generated potential future interest in enlarging the team next year.

Not only that, but this year's fundraising effort was our best yet. Under the capable leadership of Team Captain Bob Coveney, we broke our previous record and managed to raise \$13,195, blowing our goal of \$10k out of the water and representing a whopping 18% of the total amount raised throughout Marion County. Our team members were individually awesome as well; three of the top six individual fundraisers are Meadow Woods Memory Walkers. We are the #2 team in the county, and Meadow Wood Farms is the #1 non-corporate sponsoring group. That's not bad for a little neighborhood group of friends!



In this column over the last several years, I have taken you hither and yon, sharing our experiences in restaurants and coffee shops, on golf courses and in freshwater springs, and mounted on bicycles and horses. He is a junior at Westport and a very good player on the team. He plays "both ways," as a wide receiver on offense and as a free safety on defense. He also handles the punting duties. In short, he is a much better athlete than I ever was, and we love to watch the team play. They are 5-1 this year and really having fun. It's a joy to both go to the games and, for me, to go back in time.





Also last weekend, on Saturday, our own MWFPOA sponsored Movie Night in Friendship Park. It was fondly reminiscent of the days of going to the drive-in movie in my high school days. Again, I was with my best girl. The show began with a cartoon, just like movies in the old days. The cartoon was followed by "Young Frankenstein," the uproariously funny Mel Brooks sendup of the old horror films. We were joined by about 30 friends and neighbors, drank a few adult beverages, and had hot popcorn from the rented machine. In many ways, it was a trip back in time.

In neither case did we venture far. In neither case were we unnecessarily or carelessly exposed to the dreaded virus that has gripped our lives. In both cases, I spent almost no money, enjoyed the company of my best girl/best friend/wife, was treated to memories of some of the best times of my life, and laughed and/or smiled the entire time. In short, life is good Out & About, and it doesn't have to be either far or expensive. There will be more of these evenings. We will continue taking full advantage of the opportunity to be... *Out & About.*


