

It was just a few weeks ago. I had just returned from a quick trip to Charlotte, NC – but that's a story for another time. It was Thursday and some very close friends stopped by to spend a couple of days with us on their way back to Michigan from Ft. Myers. While not a total surprise, we hadn't really planned anything. So we decided to show them (and us) the newest addition to our "neighborhood." Off to the new World Equestrian Center, or WEC as we locals are now calling it, we went. It was a beautiful Friday evening. WEC advertised live music on the plaza. I'm a huge fan of live music and at least a casual, if uneducated, fan of the horse world. It seemed like a decent idea to me. And wow, what a place!



For the most part, I spent the evening wandering around the place with my jaw hanging slack. First and foremost, I was struck by its sheer magnitude. It's huge! More than that, I was overwhelmed by the quality and class exhibited at every turn. From the paver plaza and sidewalks to the cleanliness and design, you can't help but think of the place as a Disneyland for horse people.

As you walk into the plaza from the main parking lot, you are facing a gorgeous bronze statue of Reckless, or more accurately Sergeant Reckless, a veteran of the Korean War. I don't have room in this column to recount her bravery and stamina, but her service during that war was heroic – and she was a horse! Candidly, it is worth the trip to WEC just to see that statue and read of her service.

Already, many of the restaurants are open. Most important, Miss Tilly's Lollipops, the ice cream shop is a treat in and of itself. Ralph's Burgers is also really good. It's a bit of a walk from the main plaza, but that walk will take you past some of the horse barns and the stunning little chapel tucked in behind the hotel—another shining example of the thought and care that have gone into designing and building the entire complex.

Add some high-end, horsey-related shopping, a convenience store, and an on-site gas station, and you have everything you need for an evening or for an extended stay in the adjacent RV area. WEC is truly remarkable, even for a non-horsey person like me. As I understand it, the hotel and two more restaurants will be opening in April: Stirrups, a fine dining steak house, and the Yellow Pony, a lobby gastro lounge featuring starters, pub fare, and craft beers. We'll be going back, probably over and over again. It's a stunning place.

And finally, on a different note and as a reminder, please join us Out and About on **Saturday, March 6**, **from 7:00 – 10:00 pm** at Friendship Park for some more fun live music with Don Middlebrook. As a Tropical Rock entertainer (think Jimmy Buffet), he takes you to the beach without leaving your seat. His songs are original, fun, and clever. Donny improvises as he goes along, including verses about people in the audience or anything else that comes to his inventive mind. His music specializes in taking you to a good place in your mind.

As spring beckons, enjoy being Out and About - but still very close to home.
