This free event in Florida's Stone Crab Capitol packs 'em in for fresh seafood, country music, carnival rides, crafts booths. An estimated 50,000 people attend each year in this small town (population 500) for the three-day event.

Strawberry Festival, Williston, February 12-13, 2022

Red, White & Blues Farm's first Strawberry Festival! There will be tons of strawberries to pick, strawberry-themed activities & treats, live music, art & craft vendors, plus all of your favorite farm activities like our thrilling slide hill, bouncy jump pillows, and more! **Admission & Parking are Free!** Includes: Strawberry-themed activities, Art & Craft Vendors, Access to Strawberry & Sunflower Fields - U-Pick Strawberries (\$4.95/lb), U-Pick Sunflowers (\$2/stem)

The Battle of Olustee Civil War Re-Enactment, Sanderson, Feb. 18-20, 2022

Florida's largest Civil War battle is re-enacted, with gun smoke, booming cannons and cavalry.

Cortez Commercial Fishing Festival, Cortez, Feb. 19-20, 2022

Cortez started as a fishing village, and it still has a working waterfront and fishing boats. The festival offers music, nautical arts and crafts, children's activities, environmental exhibits and lots of fresh seafood.

Coconut Grove Arts Festival, Coconut Grove, Miami. Feb. 19-20, 2022

A huge fair (covering many blocks with 350+ exhibitors) and a beautiful waterfront setting make this one of the most popular art festivals in Florida. As a result, it attracts top entertainers, food vendors and artists. Held annually on Presidents Day Weekend.

ArtiGras Fine Arts Festival, Jupiter, Feb. 19-20, 2022

A top juried festival with 300 artists, Artigras is celebrating 37 years of family fun this year.

Naples National Art Festival, Naples, Feb. 19-20, 2022

Ranked among the top art festivals in the state, the event takes place in scenic Cambier Park and along 8th Street South in downtown Naples.

Swamp Cabbage Festival, La Belle. Feb. 26-27, 2022

For 50+ years, this authentic Florida town east of Fort Myers has been celebrating swamp cabbage in a down-home festival and parade. A unique highlight: Armadillo races.


