HORSE FARM BEST PRACTICES

How does your farm measure up? (UF/IFAS Extension)

- · Maintain recommended stocking rates; one horse per 2-5 acres. Utilize rotational grazing for maximizing forage health and yield.
- Soil test every 2-3 years to survey nutrients that are available in the soil and those that should be supplemented.
- · Follow UF/IFAS guidelines for fertilizer applications.
- Maintain pastures with 80% vegetative cover and keep a minimum of 3 inches of forage present at all times.
- Develop a manure management plan: Compost, off site removal, or store temporarily on an impervious surface.
- · Avoid long-term stockpiling of manure or the placement of manure in sensitive areas such as surrounding bodies or in and around sinkholes.
- Use erosion control methods progressively: beginning with re-vegetation or prescribed grazing and employ more aggressive measures if necessary.
- Utilize proper integrated pest management practices on your farm; a combination of species selection, correct cultural practices, and the use of biological controls and pesticides to manage pests.
- Have an environmentally sound animal mortality plan in place; incineration or rendering by a licensed facility, burial at proper depths, or composting.

Tussock moth caterpillars

Over the last couple of weeks, if you have oak trees, you have probably seen tussock moth caterpillars (Orgyia detritas). They crawl all over anything underneath the trees. Oak trees are a host plant for the tussock moth caterpillar.

Usually the caterpillars do not have much effect on the oak trees. Most commonly in Florida, you will find either the fir tussock moth (Orgyia detrita) or the whitemarked tussock moth (Orgyia leucostigma) Lymantria means "destroyer"

In addition to the caterpillars crawling all over, you may also notice their cocoons in trees, fences or on the sides of buildings. If you see the caterpillars or their cocoons, avoid touching them as they may cause skin irritation or itching. Levels of sensitivity may vary from person to person.

Many tussock moth caterpillars have urticating hairs (*Urtica is* Latin for "nettle") often hidden among longer, softer hairs, which can cause painful reactions if they come into contact with skin.

If you feel like you must remove the cocoons, use a broom to sweep them into a pail of soapy water. Otherwise, just avoid contact and watch out for the caterpillars! The larvae and caterpillars of tussock moths have plenty of natural enemies, including beetles, birds, wasp parasitoids, and pathogens. For more information on the tussock moth caterpillar, check out UF Featured Creatures.

I have found products containing bifenthrin 7.9% has been effective in eradicating these caterpillars.


