REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

Proposals are hereby requested for a 24 month contract for the purpose of mowing and trimming the grass in the common areas of Meadow Wood Farms, Ocala, FL.

The following details are provided:

- Term: Contract will commence on or about June 1, 2024 and expire on May 31, 2026 Subsequent contracts will begin and expire on Jun 1 of the ensuing years.
- Scope: Grass areas in Meadow Wood Farms subdivision are to be mowed as follows:
 - o Entrances (includes areas adjacent to entry roads & fences extending, at a minimum, 6 fence posts in either direction)
 - § Two (2) cuts per month April through October. One (1) cut per month November through April
 - § Edging and weed trimming as needed
 - o Park:
 - § One (1) cut per month April through October then as needed
 - § Move fallen tree branches/debris to burn area before mowing
 - § Additional cuts may be requested prior to special events at the park. (See hourly rate)
 - o Blow clean all hard surfaces
- Proposal should include proposed fees with payment to be made in equal monthly payments over the term of the contract
- An hourly rate should also be included in the proposal for requests for additional incidental mowing services, such as vacant properties, water retention areas, etc.
- Proof of liability and workers compensation insurance (if applicable) should be included with the proposal
- Termination: The contract may be terminated without cause by either party with 30 days written notice.

The MWFPOA reserves the right to accept or reject any proposal at will. Residence in Meadow Wood Farms and Membership in the MWFPOA, while not required, will positively influence the contract award.

Recognition and Appreciation for our MWF residents April 2024

As soon as the call ended, Gena sprang into action asking Michael Pineiro and Ian Reade if they could join her to help unload a new MWF resident's truck and they agreed.

Around the same time this conversation was taking place, a post was made by Gretchen Ness on a "Jobs Hiring Ocala" Facebook page asking for help to unload a moving truck at their new residence in Meadow Wood Farms. The help was needed at 1 pm that afternoon. Carolyn Camp received that post from a friend and then reposted it in our Meadow Wood Farms private Facebook group. Three MWF residents immediately responded – Dean and Marissa Bardino and Paul Wilson.

All six of our MWF residents dropped what they were doing to respond to this new resident's request for help. It was the best introduction to our Meadow Wood Farms community Gino Laney and Gretchen Ness could have possibly received. A few days later, Gino posted the following message in our MWF Facebook group:



But the story doesn't end there...

The next day Ian Reade, Mark Cooper and Dan Steinbacher helped remove a tree that had fallen in Gino and Gretchen's front yard. A few days after that, Gino posted in our MWF private Facebook group a request for help in correcting faulty wiring and setup of their swimming pool. Michael Wagner reached out to help him and the pool is operational now.

All of these Meadow Wood Farms residents are to be commended for their generous response to help one of our newest residents. And that is why we are beginning a series of articles in our newsletter called "Good In The Hood." We hope to spotlight MWF residents seen going out of their way to help someone in our neighborhood and let them know how much they are appreciated by the recipients of their service and from our community.

NEIGHBOR SUBMISSION

ANOTHER BIRTHDAY

As you may have guessed from the total that I'm reaching that day of remembrance again, no this is not a public holiday but the day that I remember conversations with family, friends, colleagues and acquaintances from my past. The one thing I ask is how they cope with loneliness.

Rural neighborhoods in reality can be quite different from suburban life where front porches and backyard barbecues might evoke images of neighborly connection, The very nature of semi-rural living is homes sprawled on larger plots, creating physical distance between neighbors. Traditional closeknit communities often revolved around shared workplaces or local businesses, but these are less common in sprawling rural developments. The South is experiencing a demographic shift.

Retirees seeking a slower pace can find themselves isolated, especially if they haven't established deep roots in the community. Younger families, busy with work and children's activities, may struggle to find the time or energy to forge connections. Technology is a great connector, but may also contribute to isolation. While social media allows us to stay in touch with loved ones far away, it can also become a crutch, replacing face-to-face interaction with the pale glow of a screen. Without face-to-face communication you can't read the person's body language. Friends on Facebook may not really be friends, the proof is when you make a post that they disagree with and they become more than willing to disconnect or berate you.

My way to counter loneliness is to <u>volunteer</u> around the community, help the neighbors, wave to people in the approaching vehicles. Stop and talk to people across fence lines, collecting litter from the swales and carrying dog treats in the truck gives me an excuse to talk to dog walkers. Yes, I have been known to help a neighbor repair a fence. <u>Attend local events</u>. Association meetings, trivia night, line dancing, equestrian club, movie night, car shows, music events, art and craft events. Hey you may meet new friends (that you can see in person) or connect with an old friend. By fostering a spirit of neighborliness, we can create communities that are truly welcoming and supportive, ensuring that the warmth of the Meadow Wood Farms sun extends not just to the landscape, but to the hearts of its residents as well.
