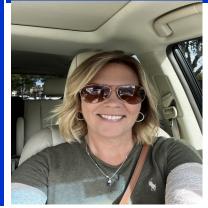

An Open Letter to my Sons:

A few years ago, I wrote that I wish my Dad were still around so that I could ask him about what it was like to be 64. I'm 71 now and this still rings so very true. I thought I'd share it with you:

I really don't know if I'll be around when my five sons turn 71 and even if I am, I may not remember being 71. They are all in their 30's and 40's now. They are raising families, buying houses, and making their way through their careers. Blessedly, they are all doing great. We are very lucky parents, indeed.

But boys, when you get to 65 or 70, if I am not around or can't remember who I am or who you are, let me share a few things with you.

- · You probably won't need an alarm clock. Sleeping in means sleeping until 6:30 am not noon!
- · When you wake up in the morning, it will NOT be the first time. You will have gotten up once, twice, three times, or more to pee, pass gas, or just get a drink of water. I know, because of your kids, you don't sleep through every night now, but just wait. A full night's sleep will be a thing of the past.
- You will ease yourself out of bed not jump out of bed. No matter how good of shape you may be in (and I'm in pretty good shape for my age) you will be stiff and achy in the morning. Your ankles, or your knees, or your back will scream at you. "Slow down, old man. I hurt!" If you are lucky like me and have taken reasonably good care of yourself, your aches and pains won't be debilitating. They will just be annoying.
- You will wake up on some days and hurt in some place that you certainly didn't hurt yesterday or last night. You'll wonder "what the hell did I do in the middle of the night" to my ... shoulder ... hip ... back... neck ... whatever?
 - All of this and you haven't even made it to your first cup of coffee!
- By this time in your life, you may be retired, or semi-retired, or at least considering retirement. You will still be working just as hard as you used to or at least as hard as your somewhat diminished energy level will tolerate but you will NOT be just sitting around waiting for the sun to rise. Did I mention that you will not be sleeping in?
- · Your hearing will be fading. Huh? Your eyes will betray you. Even your teeth will start to crack and chip and break. Even if you are healthy, you will spend more time going to various doctors and hanging around waiting rooms than you care to think about. Take a book with you. It'll help pass the time.
- You will look back more often than you look forward. If you are lucky like me, you will look back and smile, for the most part. You will have made some mistakes and wish you had a few do-overs, but you will remember a great number of things that just make you smile.
- · Again, if you are very lucky, you will still have the opportunity to do some "bucket list" things. DO THEM! Life is too short. I can assure you that you will not want to be on your death bed and say "I wish I had ..." I plan to get to mine saying, "I'm so glad I did..."
- You will wish you could spend more time with your kids. I know I do. I didn't grow up with a large, close-knit sort of family and never really learned how important family should be. It's just not something I seem to get. And yet, I miss all of you terribly. I miss teaching you. I miss coaching you. I miss laughing with you. I miss everything about life with you. But I have grown older and so have you. You can beat me now at golf, or one-on-one in hoops, or darn near anything else. You have your own families. Your lives don't really include me now and I get it. But I'll be here, if and when you need me.

Because I love you. Thank you boys, simply for being my sons.

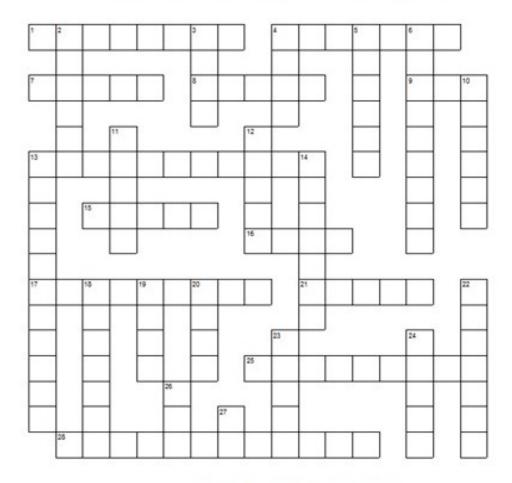
