#### **March General Association Meeting**

Wow, what a meeting! It started off with a food truck Brick and Embers Pizza, organized by Kim Cooper - Thank you!!! The food was delicious and served pretty quickly. More than a 100 orders were processed in a short amount of time.

Roughly 50-60 people attended the meeting following the food truck. In fact we had enough people that we had to dust off the microphone to make sure that everyone in the back could hear. There was a lot of lively discussion surrounding the item that was to be voted on, primarily adding a water source to the park. This is a big ticket item, and at the end of the discussion it was voted to earmark the two CD's worth approximately \$10,500 towards the water source and to also include some fund raising so as to not deplete the POA funds. #### **NEIGHBOR SUBMISSION**

What do you think? We would love some feedback and input from you.

A clubhouse for MWF!?! This could be such a cool thing! Just imagine, a place to meet and visit, maybe have a book, puzzle and or DVD exchange. A place to meet to play cards and games in addition to having MWF events and meetings all in an enclosed building, with temperature control and mostly insect-free (as possible as that is for Florida anyway). Would this bring out more residents and promote more of a community feel? Can MWF handle having a clubhouse? No locked gate at the park, no hall monitors?

How do you feel about the possibility of having a clubhouse?

When the dues were raised 2 years ago because the price of everything else has gone up. Should some of that money be earmarked for a project?

Should we look into changing how we vote, where whatever is being voted on is presented before the actual vote, so you have time to think about it and present any questions, comments or concerns on the topic. Where you can email a board member if unable to attend, as everyone cannot always attend meetings, get to meetings, etcetera. And if you're a member then you should be able to vote whether you are in attendance or not. One would think it would be possible within a tiny community to have all the members be able to vote. What are your thoughts on this?

How do you feel about how we currently vote on things?

Do you find it easy to locate the entrances to MWF at night in the dark because they are lit up? The electric bill here is about 220.00 per month, or about \$2,600.00 per year. MWF has liability insurance that costs about \$2,000.00 per year, these are just some of the larger expenses. The very small amount of \$95.00 per year of becoming a member and contributing to the community as a whole helps pay for some of the expenses. It is one thing if you are unable to afford the \$95.00 membership, but if you are able to afford the membership, and don't, you are expecting other residents to carry the burden that should be shared by everyone.

If you are not a member, why aren't you?

Has anyone ever tried to clean something without any water? It typically isn't easy. To clean anything at the pavilion we have to bring in water. To wash the 100 some dishes from our Veteran's Day BBQ, someone takes all of those un-rinsed dishes home to wash them. To clean the tables and chairs for that event and others, we have to bring in water. Water is a pretty essential thing. I have no idea how long we have had a portable toilet in the park, but it is not without a fee. We currently are paying about \$150.00 per month to rent the portable toilet, that is \$1,800.00 per year, in 5 years that is \$9,000.00 not to own a bathroom. A water source at the park would be an asset on its own and would also be needed if there ever was to be a bathroom, kitchen or clubhouse.

At the last General Association Meeting, the majority voted to have a water source installed using our two CD's, worth approximately \$10,500 and also do some fund raising in order to not completely deplete our funds.

If you could please give us your thoughts back on this, it would be greatly appreciated. Responses can be mailed or just dropped off, you do not need to put your name on the response, but it would be great if you would indicate if you were or were not a member.
