Our next meeting is scheduled for January 22nd. Come and join in on the fun.

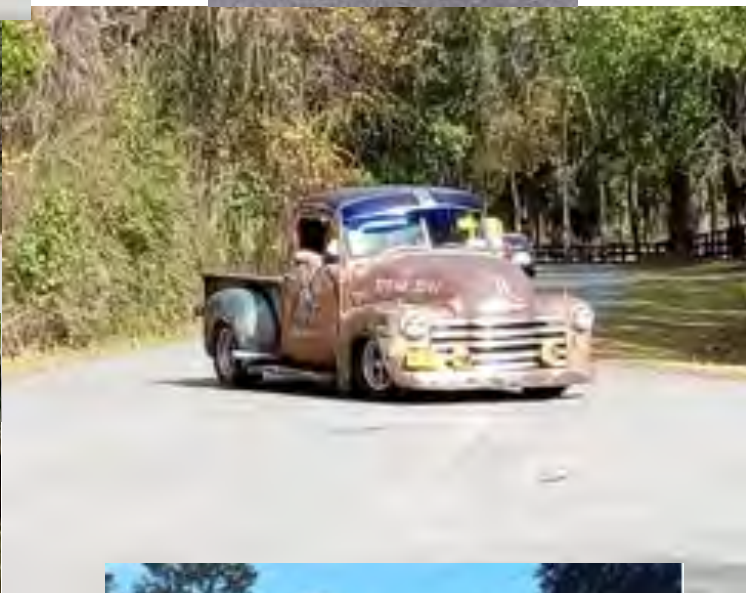
